- Teaching placements need to be long term - Is it beneficial for a child to have a different English teacher each month....?!

Get some work experience!

Paid employment, internships or volunteer work, in the UK or abroad - holding down a steady job looks great on your CV & UCAS form and shows maturity and independence.

Investigate potential career options; try out different jobs to work out what you really find interesting and ensure that you have applied for the right course at university.

- Universities will often look for students who have made the effort to undertake relevant work experience to show their commitment to over-subscribed courses.
- Deloitte, Accenture, Bank of England, BBC, NHS, Rothschild, Ernst & Young, KPMG, Arup, Arsenal Football Club, Barnados, British Red Cross and Christian Aid are amongst some of the big organisations and companies offering work experience or specific Gap Year internships.

Sell your Gap Year!

Focus on the transferable key skills you have acquired; leadership, teamwork and communication skills.
